We are a Seattle-based, 501c3 non-profit organization that empowers young people to become active leaders in creating a just and sustainable future. The year-long Leadership Program provides local youth with a global perspective, empowering them to understand the intrinsic relationships between local, international, social and environmental justice issues while instilling a life-long ethic of service and philanthropy. Fifty percent of our students come from low-income families. A highlight of the program is the extraordinary educational trips to Guatemala involving language and cultural immersion, volunteer work and adventure. Our goal is to fundamentally transform the way in which youth approach the problems facing their generation by acting in partnership with youth through trainings, leadership guidance, and by providing the organizational infrastructure in which youth can become visionary leaders. Our programs challenge students to build relationships that extend beyond borders, stereotypes, and politics in order to inspire a new generation of global leaders in creating a just and sustainable future.

We are interested in our interns and volunteers developing NEW skill sets as well as gaining more experience in those skill sets they bring to our organization.

Interns must also be dependable, committed to the time they sign up for, and able to work independently. Our intern's hard work, heartfelt generosity and dedication, greatly strengthens our programs and allows us to contribute more to financial aid for our students. We accept internship applications on a rolling basis. All internships are unpaid and we require a signed commitment of 6 months for all positions. The hours per week vary depending on which internship position you are involved in, but most require 10-15 hours per week on average and the hours are flexible.
